SKILLFUL STATE PLAYBOOK

As part of the Skillful State Network's developing portfolio of tools, the Skillful State Playbook lays out the steps needed to create a skills-based labor market. The Playbook offers tools and resources jointly developed by Skillful, the state of Colorado, and numerous employers, tech companies including Microsoft and LinkedIn, educators, and community organizations. The free and public availability of the Skillful State Playbook establishes a model for the open sharing of best practices. Skillful State Network members may tailor or improve tools in the Playbook and add their own tools and resources to the Network's portfolio.



The Skillful State Playbook includes assets and tools to implement each step and spur systemic change:

1. Align your partners.
2. Assess your labor market and identify the hot jobs.
3. Empower employers to recruit and hire based on competencies.
4. Incentivize educators and trainers to teach based on competencies.
5. Help job coaches help job seekers.
6. Prepare job seekers to make the transition to a skills-based workforce.
7. Assess your policy levers.
